
I am going to **clinic 10** at **Children's of Alabama**. This story will help teach me about my visit.

My family and I will park in the parking deck.






We will walk across the **crosswalk** on the 2nd floor.

Check In and Waiting Room






My family and I will stop at this **desk** to check in.

Triage




When my name is called, I will walk into a room called triage. I may hear different sounds in this area.

Vitals




I will have my **vital signs** checked.* Vital signs help the nurses and doctors learn more about my body.
